Course Description

Techniques required for developing professional eCommerce web applications such as securing a web site, authenticating users, and configuring and deploying applications will be covered in this course. Students will also learn how to use a variety of data access features including SQL, object data sources and stored procedures. Prerequisite: CIS 236

Outcomes

Course Outcomes

During this course we will work on developing multi-page ASP.NET Core MVC applications that use databases. We will use Bootstrap to create a responsive web applications, in addition we will work on testing and debugging these applications. We will expand on some skills such as Razor views, model binding, data validation, EF (Entity Framework) Core, session state and cookies. This course will present skills that will take your web development to a professional level. We will also work with dependency injection (DI), unit testing, custom tag helpers, partial views, view components, authentication, and authorization.

You will apply the programming skills that you will learn in ASP.NET Core MVC by developing a website called SportsProTechnical Support. The purpose of this website is to track technical support service calls (incidents) in a database that also stores information about the company's customers, software products, and technicians.
